Important Information

Trailer

This BRP Sea-Doo ADVANCED TEC trailer has been specially designed to carry a personal watercraft (PWC).

A WARNING

iCatch[™] mechanism must be specifically adjusted to the personal watercraft (PWC) model and used exclusively with the iCatch bow cup. An Incorrect adjustment may cause the iCatch mechanism to not adequately secure the personal watercraft (PWC) to the trailer.

Hitch

The use of a hitch with an insufficient load rating can result in hitch breakdown.

Be sure the hitch ball size matches the coupler size.

Inspect the hitch for wear, corrosion and cracks before coupling. Replace the required components if any of the above conditions is observed.

WARNING

Do not tow whenever a component is defective.

NOTICE The coupling socket should not be allowed to rest on the ground where dirt and sand can enter the socket. This will lead to excessive wear or cause the locking mechanism to jam.

Ensure hitch is tight before coupling the trailer to the vehicle.

An improperly coupled trailer can result in a loss of control or serious road hazard. Never use the trailer pre-use inspection is completed.

Tow Vehicle

Some vehicles are not intended to tow a trailer. Make sure your vehicle is designed to tow a trailer and its towing capacity is sufficient.

A WARNING

Never tow this trailer with a vehicle not intended for trailer towing or with an insufficient towing capacity.

Accessories and Modifications

We recommend to use replacement parts and accessories from BRP. They've been especially designed for your trailer and manufactured to meet BRP's demanding standards.



AWARNING

- Coupler hitch and trailer ball are the same size. Coupler is latched. Safety chains are crisscrossed under tongue and attached to towing vehicle
- All trailer lighting is working correctly. Load is secured to trailer (front and rear). Tongue jack (if trailer is equipped) is retracted.
- Wheel lug bolts are properly tightened. Tires are inflated to pressure indicated on tire.
 Load is within trailer capacity and distributed properly to maintain proper tongue weight.

You are required to comply with local and state requirements regarding brakes, licensing and any additional equipment that may be necessary. Contact your state motor vehicle department for more information

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

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OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

TRAILER SET-UP

Fitting the Trailer to the Watercraft (ADVANCED TEC iCatch)

The iCatch system must be adjusted specifically to the personal watercraft (PWC) hull type.

The iCatch system must be used along with the iCatch bow cup available at an authorized Sea-Doo dealer.

WARNING

iCatch mechanism must be specifically adjusted to the personal watercraft (PWC) model and used exclusively with the iCatch bow cup. An incorrect adjustment may cause the iCatch mechanism to not adequately secure the personal watercraft (PWC) to the trailer.

There are three parameters to set on the iCatch system to fit the listed Sea-Doo models:

- iCatch housing angle
- iCatch support height
- Bumper position.

Also, rollers contact and tongue weight must be adjusted if necessary. Tongue weight is adjusted by changing the iCatch support and/or axle position on the frame.

For proper adjustment guidelines, refer to the following tables and procedures.

iCatch Housing Angle Setting

- 1. Loosen the iCatch housing upper bolt.
- 2. Remove the iCatch housing lower bolt.




- 1. Upper bolt
- 2. Window
- 3. Lower front hole 4. Lower bolt (in rear hole)
- 3. Set angle:
 - 3.1 Bring angle to the appropriate setting. The setting refers to the number visible in the window.
 - 3.2 Lock iCatch housing in place by inserting the bolt through the appropriate lower hole.

NOTE: The front or rear lower hole will be aligned with the iCatch housing hole depending on the setting.

3.3 Tighten to nuts 27 N•m ± 3 N•m $(20 \text{ lbf} \bullet \text{ft} \pm 2 \text{ lbf} \bullet \text{ft}).$


iCatch Support Height Setting

1. Remove iCatch support bolts and install in the appropriate holes.



1. iCatch support bolts

NOTE: The iCatch support height setting refers to the lower bolt position. Insert upper bolt just above the tongue.

WARNING

There must be precisely 5 unused holes between upper and lower bolts.


- 2. Progressively tighten nuts in a crisscross pattern until support is square with the trailer tongue. Do not tighten vet.
- 3. Adjust tongue weight, refer to TONGUE WEIGHT below.
- 4. Final tightening is 8N•m ± 1N•m $(71 \, \text{lbf} \bullet in \pm 9 \, \text{lbf} \bullet in).$

TRAILER SET-UP

Bumper Position Setting


The bumper position setting consists of a particular position of both the bumper holes and support holes.

- 1. Remove bumper retaining bolts.
- 2. Align appropriate support holes and bumper together.



SUPPORT HOLES

- 1. Position 1
- 2. Position 2
- 3. Position 3
- 4. Position 4



BUMPER HOLES

- 1. Position 1
- 2. Position 2
- 3. Install bolts loosely into proper positions.
- 4. **IMPORTANT:** Move bumper upwards then towards front and maintain it in this position.



MOVE UPWARDS THEN FORWARD

 Tighten bolts to 27 N•m ± 3 N•m (20 lbf•ft ± 2 lbf•ft).

NOTE: It is important to maintain bumper fully upwards and forward to eliminate any play in the assembly before tightening.

Axle Positioning

To suit all Sea-Doo watercraft models, the trailer axle must be moved forward from the factory position. Refer to AXLE/WALK PAD SUPPORT POSI-TION in SETTING TABLE above in this document.

There are 3 possible positions.


Position 1	 Factory settings. 30 cm (12 in) from roller support.
Position 2	 Axle is moved between factory position and front roller support. Approximately 15 cm (6 in) from roller support. Walk pad support is secured using the front walk pad retaining bolt.
Position 3	 Axle is positioned against the front roller support. Left and right walk pad supports are interchanged and pointed rearward.



P1 = Position 1 P2 = Position 2 P3 = Position 3

To set axle to the required position, proceed as follows:

1. Loosen clamps bolts on both sides of the axle.




1. Axle clamps bolts

- 2. Remove both walk pad supports.
 - To move axle from position 1 to position 2, remove the upper walk pad support bolts only.
 - To move the axle to position 3, remove both walk pad support from the trailer.



1. Walk pad support

3. Move axle to the desired position (as per *SETTING TABLE* information).



^{1.} Front rollers support

- 4. Reinstall walk pad support.
 - In position 1, secure the support using the rear walk pad support bolt.
 - In position 2, secure the support using the front walk pad support bolt.
 - In position 3, install the RH walk pad support at left and the LH walk pad support at right. Use the rear walk pad support bolt.
- 5. Tighten all bolts.



Rollers

The rollers are preset to suit all Sea-Doo personal watercraft (PWC) hull designs, however, a universal rule applies: rollers must lean square against a plain area of the hull.

Make sure the rollers or bunks are well positioned.

- A. Plain area of hull


Tongue Weight

Move iCatch support towards front or rear of trailer in order to adjust tongue weight.

The tongue weight should be from 3 to 10% of the total trailer and PWC weight with tongue parallel to the ground.

A measurement is provided as an indication, however, the 3 to 10% rule prevails.

See following illustration and table for measurement instructions.

To adjust, loosen the iCatch support bolts, move support to the desired position, then tighten nuts as follows:

- 1. Progressively tighten nuts in a crisscross pattern until support is square with the trailer tongue.
- 2. Tighten to $8 N \bullet m \pm 1 N \bullet m$ (71 lbf•in ± 9 lbf•in).

Fitting the Trailer to the Watercraft (ADVANCED TEC)


Set tongue weight, bow stopper roller, and bunks as follows.

Tongue Weight

Move winch support towards front or rear of trailer in order adjust tongue weight.

The tongue weight should be from 3 to 10% of the total trailer and PWC weight with tongue parallel to the ground.

To adjust, loosen the 4 nuts underneath the winch support u-bolts, move winch support to the desired position, then tighten nuts to $27 \text{ N} \cdot \text{m} \pm 3 \text{ N} \cdot \text{m}$ (20 lbf•ft ± 2 lbf•ft).



1. Winch support u-bolts nuts

Bow Stopper Roller


Set bow roller stopper so that it leans on the PWC bow between rubber bumper and bow eyelet.

To adjust:

- 1. Loosen the 2 nuts underneath the front winch support u-bolt.
- 2. Remove the winch arm adjustment bolt.

TRAILER SET-UP

3. Set the bow roller stopper to the desired height, then lock it in position by inserting the bolt through the aligned winch support and winch arm holes.



- 1. Winch arm
- 2. Winch arm adjustment bolt
- 3. Winch support
- 4. Front u-bolt nuts
- Tighten u-bolt nuts to 27 N•m ± 3 N•m (20 lbf•ft ± 2 lbf•ft).
- Tighten winch arm adjustment bolt to 27 N•m ± 3 N•m (20 lbf•ft ± 2 lbf•ft).

Bunks

The wooden bunks are preset to suit all Sea-Doo personal watercraft (PWC) hull designs, however, a universal rule applies: bunks must lean square against a plain area of the hull.

Make sure the bunks are well positioned.




- 1. Bunk square with hull

BEFORE GETTING UNDERWAY


Attaching the Trailer to the Tow Vehicle

- 1. Make sure that the coupler and hitch ball are the same size.
- 2. Have someone guiding you and back the tow vehicle as close as possible to the trailer. This is easier and safer than pulling the trailer to the vehicle.
- 3. Be sure the coupler-locking mechanism is released.
- 4. Raise the front end of the trailer. Position the coupler directly over the hitch ball and lower until it is all the way down.



TYPICAL

- 1. Coupler-locking mechanism (released)
- 2. Coupler
- 3. Hitch ball
- 5. Check under the coupling to be certain that the ball clamp is below the ball and not riding on top of the ball.




TYPICAL

- 1. Coupler-locking mechanism (released)
- 2. Hitch ball in coupler
- 3. Ball clamp
- 6. Lock the coupler to the hitch ball. Be sure the coupler is in the locked position and the locking pin is placed through the coupler-locking mechanism. Lift up on the trailer tongue. If it comes loose from the ball, unlock and start procedure again.

A WARNING

If the coupler cannot be secured to hitch ball, do not tow the trailer. Refer to an authorized Sea-Doo dealer to inspect the trailer as soon as possible.




1. Locking pin

NOTE: At this point the tow vehicle and the trailer should be level.

7. Attach the tongue safety cables or chains. Attach the left cable or chain to the bracket on the right side of hitch and the right cable or chain to the left bracket.

NOTICE To avoid damaging wiring harness, ensure the harness is not passed between the tongue safety cables or chains.



- 1. LH tongue safety cable attached to the RH side of hitch

- 8. Connect lights connector.

Pre-Use Inspection

A WARNING

Perform a pre-use inspection before each use to detect potential problems during operation. The pre-use inspection can help you monitor wear and deterioration before they become a problem. Correct any problems that you discover to reduce the risk of a breakdown or crash. See an authorized Sea-Doo dealer as necessary.

Make sure the hitch ball size matches the coupler size.					
Check that the personal watercraft (PWC) is ready to be towed according to the PWC manufacturer's recommendations.					
Check that the jack is retracted.					
Check tires condition and if they are properly inflated. Refer to <i>MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES</i> for details.					
Check tightness of wheel lug nuts.					
Check if load is within maximum load carrying capacity.					
Check if coupler is latched and locked.					
Check if tongue safety cables or chains are crisscrossed under tongue and attached to hitch.					
Check lights operation.					
Clean all reflectors and lights lenses.					
Check if personal watercraft (PWC) is properly secured to the trailer at rear.					
Check that the iCatch system or winch is locked.					
Make sure the personal watercraft (PWC) is properly secured at front using the safety cable.					

TOWING THE TRAILER

Follow the tow vehicle's manufacturer instructions regarding trailer towing.

SEVERE INJURY OR DEATH can result if you do not follow these instructions:

When towing the trailer, pay particular attention to the following:

- Use a longer following distance from the vehicle in front of you.
- When towing a trailer, more time and distance is needed when passing or stopping.
- Reduce your speed and slow down more than usual before turning and avoid sharp turns.
- When cornering, achieve the turn on a larger radius. It takes more space to turn with a trailer.
- Always move slowly when backing up. Ask someone to guide you when possible. Practice in an open area at the first opportunity.
- If trailer starts to sway, do not hit the brakes or compensate using the steering wheel. Reduce speed and maintain a steady course.
- When going downhill, reduce speed before starting the descent. Do not brake continuously. Apply and release brakes alternately to prevent brakes from overheating.

Loss of control of the trailer or trailer/vehicle combination can result in serious injury or death. The most common causes of loss of control of the trailer are:

- Driving too fast for the conditions.
- Overloading the trailer or loading the trailer incorrectly.
- Trailer improperly coupled to the hitch.
- Inadequate towing hitch.
- Not maintaining proper tire pressure.
- Not keeping wheel lug nuts tight.

LAUNCHING THE WATERCRAFT

Launching the Watercraft (ADVANCED TEC iCatch)

- 1. Prepare the personal watercraft (PWC) for launching according to the PWC manufacturer's recommendations.
- 2. Remove tie-downs from stern and trailer eyelets.
- 3. Remove safety cable from bow cup.
- 4. Disconnect lights connector.
- 5. Make sure the way is clear behind the trailer (in and out of water).

CAUTION The watercraft can easily travel 10 m (33 ft) on the water once launched from the trailer.

6. Have someone guiding you and back the vehicle until water level is within the water level decal upper and lower edges.



WATER LEVEL DECAL

NOTE: On very gentle slopes, water level may go over the decal zone, however, the PWC must not float above the rollers.

 Unlock the iCatch mechanism by pulling lever out and turning clockwise.



Step 1: Pull lever out Step 2: Turn clockwise

NOTE: Always make sure that the iCatch system is unlocked before attempting to unload the PWC.

- 8. Take place on the watercraft.
- 9. Put your personal flotation device (PFD) on and attach the safety lanyard to it.
- 10. Get watercraft ready for engine starting but do not start engine yet.
- 11. Pull the iCatch release handle up. Handle will stay up indicating that the iCatch is ready for further loading.



PULL HANDLE UP

12. Once the watercraft has rolled off the trailer, start engine.

NOTICE Rocks, sand or other debris will be sucked into the watercraft propulsion system if engine is operated using too much throttle in shallow water.


- 13. Moor the watercraft.
- 14. Drive the tow vehicle out of the ramp.
- 15. Connect lights connector.

Launching the Watercraft (ADVANCED TEC)

- 1. Prepare the personal watercraft (PWC) for launching according to the PWC manufacturer's recommendations.
- 2. Remove tie-downs from stern and trailer eyelets.
- 3. Disconnect lights connector.
- 4. Make sure the way is clear behind the trailer (in and out of water).
- 5. Attach ropes to the watercraft mooring cleats and prevent them from hanging.
- 6. Have someone guiding you and back the vehicle until trailer reaches the desired depth into water.

NOTE: The PWC must not float above the bunks.

7. Hold the winch handle firmly and set winch mechanism to "unwind".



SET WINCH TO "UNWIND"

- 8. Unwind until watercraft slides off the trailer and floats. It may be necessary to push the watercraft a little.
- 9. Grab the ropes previously attached to the mooring cleats, then moor the watercraft.

- 10. Drive the tow vehicle out of the ramp.
- 11. Connect lights connector.

LOADING THE WATERCRAFT

Loading the Watercraft (ADVANCED TEC iCatch)

- 1. Disconnect lights connector.
- 2. Make sure the iCatch system is unlocked and the release handle is UP.




UNLOCKED (HORIZONTAL)



HANDLE UP

Always make sure the iCatch system is unlocked before loading the watercraft.

3. Have someone guiding you and back the vehicle until water level is within the water level decal upper and lower edges.



WATER LEVEL DECAL

NOTE: On very gentle slopes, water level may go over the decal zone, however, the PWC must not float above the rollers when watercraft contacts the iCatch mechanism.

- 4. Take place on the watercraft.
- 5. Put your personal flotation device (PFD) on and attach the safety lanyard to it.
- 6. Start engine and steer watercraft at idle speed to align it with the trailer rollers.

🛦 WARNING

Make sure nobody stands on the walk pads when loading the watercraft.

7. At idle, make contact between the watercraft bow with the iCatch mechanism. It may be necessary to **slightly** depress throttle lever for this operation.

NOTICE Rocks, sand or other debris will be sucked into the watercraft propulsion system if engine is operated using too much throttle in shallow water.

NOTE: Make sure that the iCatch handle has returned in the closed position (DOWN).

Make sure the watercraft is securely latched to the iCatch mechanism. 8. Lock the iCatch mechanism.




LOCK MECHANISM

- 9. Drive the tow vehicle out of the ramp.
- 10. Secure PWC bow to the trailer using the safety cable.



Inspect safety cable before every use. Replace a damaged cable before trailering.

10.1 Pass the cable through the bow cup.




- 1. Safety cable

NOTE: Make sure that the safety cable passes between the lower iCatch mechanism wheels.




1. Safety cable

11. On both sides, secure rear of PWC to the trailer using suitable tie-downs attached to the stern eyelets and trailer eyelets to-gether.

Before towing, make sure:

- PWC is securely latched at front.
- iCatch mechanism is locked.
- PWC is secured to the trailer at rear using tie-downs.
- PWC is secured to the trailer at front using the safety cable.
- 12. Connect lights connector.


- 1. Disconnect lights connector.
- 2. Have someone guiding you and back the vehicle until the trailer reaches the desired depth into water.

NOTE: Bunks should be immersed in water just enough for the watercraft to be dragged onto them without floating over them.


- 3. Align the watercraft with the trailer bunks.
- 4. Unwind the winch and attach the hook or strap to the watercraft's bow eyelet.

5. Set winch mechanism to "wind", then wind until watercraft bow reaches the trailer bow stop roller.





- 6. Drive the tow vehicle out of the ramp.
- 7. Secure personal watercraft (PWC) on the trailer using suitable tiedowns attached to the stern eyelets and trailer eyelets together.

MAINTENANCE

MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE

Maintenance is very important for keeping your trailer in safe operating condition.

The maintenance schedule does not exempt the pre-use inspection.

NOTE: If trailer is used all year round, carry out both *STORAGE* and *PRE-SEASON* maintenance operations once a year.

At Storage

Carry out the following at trailer storage:

- Tighten loose fasteners and connections.
- Inflate tires to recommended pressure.
- Check coupler condition and lubricate.
- Lubricate jack.
- Apply DIELECTRIC GREASE (P/N 293 550 004) in all electric connectors and light bulb socket to prevent corrosion.
- ADVANCED TEC: Check winch and strap condition. Lubricate winch mechanism.
- If possible, park trailer in a protected area, garage, carport, etc.
- Raise trailer and place blocks under trailer frame to take most of the weight off the suspension and tires.

At Preseason

Carry out the following before using trailer after a storage period:

- Inspect wheels for damage.
- Check tightness of all fasteners.
- Check wheel bearing and seals.
- ADVANCED TEC iCatch: Have the iCatch mechanism, release cable and release handle condition checked by an authorized Sea-Doo dealer.
- Check wiring harness condition.
- Inspect safety cable.

MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

This section includes instructions for basic maintenance procedures. If you have the necessary mechanical skills and the required tools, you can perform these procedures. If not, see your authorized Sea-Doo dealer.

A WARNING

Torque wrench tightening specifications must be strictly adhered to.

Locking devices, when removed (e.g.: locking tabs, elastic stop nuts, cotter pins, etc.), must be replaced.

Hoses, cables or locking ties removed during a procedure must be reinstalled as per factory standards.

Safety Cable

Safety Cable Inspection

Inspect cable for damage.

Discontinue use and contact an authorized Sea-Doo dealer if cable or its liner are damaged.

WARNING

Do not use the trailer if safety cable is damaged.

Coupler

Coupler Inspection and Lubrication

Check locking mechanism operation.

Check ball socket, ball clamp and lock mechanism for wear or damage.

Apply a thin coat of multipurpose grease to the inner surface of the ball socket.

Apply light oil to the pivot and sliding surface of the lock mechanism.

Tires

Tire Pressure

Check tires pressure. Tire pressure must be checked while the tire is cold.

NOTE: Do not check the tire pressure immediately after towing the trailer. Allow at least three hours for a tire to cool down, if the trailer has been towed for as much as 1.6 km (1 mi).

TIRE PRESSURE

COLD TIRE

410 kPa (60 PSI)

Tire Inspection

Replace the tire before towing the trailer if the tire tread has less than 1.6 mm (1/16 in) depth or if the built-in wear indicator bars are visible and flush with the remainder of the tire tread.

Always replace a tire with one of the same dimensions and load limit.

Inspect both sidewalls of each tire for any bubble, cut or bulge; and replace a damaged tire before towing the trailer.

WARNING

A bubble, cut or bulge in the sidewall can result in a tire blowout and loss of control.

Wheels

Wheel Inspection

Check wheel for cracks, bumps or other damages. Replace wheel as required.

Wheel Bearings and Seals

Wheel Bearing Inspection

Install a jack under the axle and raise until the tire gets off the ground.

Push and pull the wheel from the upper edge to feel the play and rotate wheel.

MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

If any play is felt or if wheel does not turn smoothly, have the wheel bearing replaced.

Wheel Bearing Seal Inspection

A slight film of grease around the seal is normal. Have the seal replaced if an excessive leak or damage is noticed.






To remove the stop/turn/parking light bulb, push the bulb in and turn counterclockwise. To install, index the bulb base with the socket, push in, then turn to lock it in place.

To remove side marker light bulb, pry it off its socket. To install, push the bulb in the socket until it bottoms. There is no indexation for that type of bulb.

NOTE: On LH side of trailer, the license plate support is secured with taillight housing nuts. Remove nuts and support at the same time.


- 2. Cut locking tie securing taillight harness to trailer.
- 3. Remove taillight housing from trailer.
- 4. Pull taillight harness and disconnect taillight wires connectors from the main harness.



- 5. Put some DIELECTRIC GREASE (P/N 293 550 004) on new taillight connector leads.
- 6. Connect the taillight wires to the main harness.






1. New locking ties



Clean grease fitting, then lubricate using multipurpose grease. Rotate handle to distribute grease evenly.

Lubricate handle pivot point and wheel axle with light oil. Wipe excess oil and rotate parts to distribute oil evenly.

Check wooden bunks carpet condition and wood hardness.

Rollers (ADVANCED TEC iCatch)

Check rollers for looseness wear, cracks or damage.

TRAILER CARE

Salt Water Use

If trailer used in salt water, thoroughly rinse trailer daily with fresh water.

Trailer Cleaning

- 1. Rinse the trailer thoroughly with fresh water to remove loose dirt.
- 2. Using a soft, clean cloth, wash the trailer with water mixed with a mild detergent, such as soap specially formulated for motorcycles or automobiles.
- 3. While washing the trailer, check for grease or oil. An automotive grease remover can be used. Thoroughly follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- 4. Dry the trailer with a chamois or a soft towel.

A CAUTION Never use any kind of vinyl or plastic protector on the walk pads as they would get slippery.

This limited warranty will become null and void if the Trailer has been altered or modified in such a way so as to adversely affect its operation, performance or durability, or has been altered or modified to change its intended use.

All genuine Trailer parts and accessories installed on the Trailer by an authorized Sea-Doo Dealer at the time of delivery of the Trailer will carry the same warranty as that of the Trailer.

2. LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY

THIS WARRANTY IS EXPRESSLY GIVEN AND ACCEPTED IN LIEU OF ANY AND ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESSED OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FIT-NESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. TO THE EXTENT THAT THEY CANNOT BE DISCLAIMED, THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES ARE LIMITED IN DURATION TO THE LIFE OF THE EXPRESS WARRANTY. INCIDENTAL AND CONSE-QUENTIAL DAMAGES ARE EXCLUDED FROM COVERAGE UNDER THIS WARRANTY. SOME STATES/PROVINCES DO NOT ALLOW FOR THE DIS-CLAIMERS, LIMITATIONS AND EXCLUSIONS IDENTIFIED ABOVE, AS A RESULT, THEY MAY NOT APPLY TO YOU. THIS WARRANTY GIVES YOU SPECIFIC RIGHTS, AND YOU MAY ALSO HAVE OTHER LEGAL RIGHTS WHICH MAY VARY FROM STATE TO STATE, OR PROVINCE TO PROVINCE.

Neither the distributor, any Sea-Doo Dealer nor any other person has been authorized to make any affirmation, representation or warranty regarding the Trailer, other than those contained in this limited warranty, and if made, shall not be enforceable against BRP. BRP reserves the right to modify this warranty at any time, being understood that such modification will not alter the warranty conditions applicable to the Trailer sold while this warranty is in effect.

3. EXCLUSIONS – ARE NOT WARRANTED

The following are not warranted under any circumstances:

- Replacement of routine maintenance items including the performance of adjustments.
- Normal wear and tear.
- Damages related to the appearance of the Trailer, including without limitation scratches, dents, fading, flaking, and peeling.
- Damage caused by failure to provide proper maintenance or storage, as described in the Operator's Guide.
- Damage resulting from removal of parts, improper repairs, improper service or improper maintenance, modifications, alterations that are outside of the original specifications of the Trailer, or damage resulting from repairs done by a person that is not an authorized servicing Sea-Doo Dealer.

- Damage resulting from the installation of parts with specifications that differ from the original Trailer parts, such as, without limitation, different tires or wheels.
- Damage resulting from abuse, abnormal use, or neglect.
- Damage resulting from accident, road hazards, submersion, fire, theft, vandalism or any act of God.
- Damage resulting from corrosion from road salts, environmental influences or treatment contrary to the Operator's Guide.
- Incidental or consequential damages, including without limitation towing, storage, telephone, rental, taxi, inconvenience, insurance coverage, loan payments, loss of time, loss of income.

4. WARRANTY COVERAGE PERIOD

This warranty will be in effect from the date of delivery to the first retail consumer or the date the Trailer is first put into use, whichever occurs first and for the following periods:

- 1. **TWELVE (12) CONSECUTIVE MONTHS** for private, recreational use, except that the frame is covered for **SIXTY (60) CONSECUTIVE MONTHS**;
- 2. FOUR (4) CONSECUTIVE MONTHS for commercial use, except that the frame is covered for TWELVE (12) CONSECUTIVE MONTHS.

A Trailer is used commercially when it is used in connection with any work or employment that generates income, during any part of the warranty period. A Trailer is also used commercially when, at any point during the warranty period, it is licensed for commercial use.

The repair or replacement of parts or the performance of service under this warranty does not extend the life of this warranty beyond its original expiration date.

5. CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR WARRANTY COVERAGE

- The Trailer must be purchased as new and unused by its first owner from a Sea-Doo dealer authorized to distribute Trailers in the country in which the sale occurred ("Sea-Doo Dealer").
- The BRP specified pre-delivery inspection process must be completed, documented and signed by the purchaser.
- The Trailer must have undergone proper warranty registration by an authorized Sea-Doo Dealer.
- The Trailer must be purchased in the country in which the purchaser resides.
- Routine maintenance must be performed as indicated in the Operator's Guide. BRP reserves the right to make warranty coverage contingent upon proof of proper maintenance.

BRP will not honor this limited warranty to any private use owner or commercial use owner if one of the preceding conditions has not been met. Such limitations are necessary in order to allow BRP to preserve both the safety of its products, and also that of its consumers and the general public.

6. WHAT TO DO TO OBTAIN WARRANTY COVERAGE

The customer must cease using the Trailer upon the appearance of an anomaly. The customer must notify a servicing Sea-Doo Dealer within two (2) days of the appearance of a defect, and provide it with reasonable access to the product and reasonable opportunity to repair it. The customer must also present to the authorized Sea-Doo Dealer proof of purchase of the product and must sign the repair/work order prior to starting the repair in order to validate the warranty repair. All parts replaced under this limited warranty become the property of BRP.

7. WHAT BRP WILL DO

BRP's obligations under this warranty are limited to, at its sole discretion, repairing parts found defective under normal use, maintenance and service, or replacing such parts with new genuine Trailer parts without charge for parts and labor, at any authorized Sea-Doo Dealer during the warranty coverage period. No claim of breach of warranty shall be cause for cancellation or rescission of the sale of the Trailer to the owner.

In the event that service is required outside of the country of original sale, the owner will bear responsibility for any additional charges due to local practices and conditions, such as, but not limited to, freight, insurance, taxes, license fees, import duties, and any and all other financial charges, including those levied by governments, states, territories and their respective agencies.

BRP reserves the right to improve or modify products from time to time without assuming any obligation to modify any products previously manufactured.

8. TRANSFER

If the ownership of a Trailer is transferred during the warranty coverage period, this warranty shall also be transferred and be valid for the remaining coverage period provided that BRP is notified of such transfer of ownership in the following way:

- 1. The former owner contacts BRP (at the phone number provided below) or an authorized Sea-Doo Dealer and gives the coordinates of the new owner; or
- 2. BRP or an authorized Sea-Doo Dealer receives a proof that the former owner agreed to the transfer of ownership, in addition to the coordinates of the new owner.
